1 Product Description

This Supplement provides Samba Version 3.0.24 and supporting modules which significantly enhances the Samba capabilities currently supported by UnixWare 7.1.4. With this supplement Samba now supports three new roles on UnixWare 7.1.4. Samba may be configured using an OpenLDAP back end as a Primary Domain Controller (PDC) for both Windows and UNIX systems similar to a Windows NT4 PDC or Windows 2003 server in mixed mode, with support for roaming profiles and login scripts. Samba can be configured as a Domain Member Server and join a Windows NT4 or Windows 2000/2003 domain in mixed mode. Samba may also be configured as a Domain Member Server and join a native mode Windows 2003 AD realm using Kerberos ticketing. When used in concert with PAM and NSS, the Samba supplement also enables common cross-platform system authentication.

Windows users can now access simple file and print services or full domain login and features without knowing or caring that those service are being offered by a UnixWare host.

2 Availability
